I'm a social worker and mother to six-year-old Jessica and 15-monthold Jokebed.

My love for children started in primary school. I was close to social workers in the sponsorship program,

and I wanted to model the love and advice they gave to children to help them have a brighter future.

#### I love children.

When I began work, I used my first year's salary to pay my father's medical costs. Without this money he could have passed away. And, I've supported my younger brother's education since he was in Grade 6. Now he's studying economics in university. I have a house, and I'm very proud I can provide for myself and my family.

The sponsorship program allowed me to achieve my goals and pursue my studies. For years, half of my school fees were paid by my sponsor, Agnes. I also received school supplies and uniforms as well as financial support at Christmas, Easter and other special occasions.

#### My sponsor still inspires me.

I still remember the words my sponsor used to encourage my studies and express her love – phrases like: "you're special," "you'll make it," and "you'll have a great future."

Today, I use the same words to encourage the children I work with. I say: "You're special. You'll make it. You can succeed. You have a great future."

By sharing kind words, my sponsor motivated me to work hard and succeed. I would love to hug Agnes and thank her. I've shed tears of love for her, because she helped me make it. I encourage those who can sponsor a child to do it with love, happiness and patience. You provide a child with a better future and support a family and an entire nation.

Before I was sponsored I spent much of my time on the streets and was exposed to many risks. After I was sponsored I got involved in lots of activities, including child-rights training, which helped develop my

self-confidence. It was a big change in my life.

#### I want to be an inspiration for others.

As a kid, every time I visited a barbershop I wanted to learn how to cut hair. Through sponsorship I joined an entrepreneurship program and received funding and technical training to start a barbershop of my own. I was scared to put my training into practice, but I made a big effort to overcome my fear. Now, I have many clients and train youth who want to learn the trade. I advise them to stay off the streets.

My sponsor, Pam, is like a second family to me. My family's economic situation was very bad, but, thanks to Pam's support, I was a cheerful child. Her impact was very big.

When I was in third grade my schoolbooks got drenched in the rain and my parents couldn't afford to replace them. I felt dejected, but they were replaced through the sponsorship program, which

provided education materials every year after. And, when my eighth-grade friends said I wasn't bold or brave enough to realize my dream of teaching, the sponsorship program introduced me to the Child Rights' Protection Forum where I was encouraged to socialize, speak up and even give speeches. I grew courageous.

#### I love my sponsor, and I miss her.

My sponsor shaped me from childhood. She said I must pursue higher education at any cost. I told my dad her wishes and said I will meet all expenses with the money my sponsor sent me. He would not need to pay a penny. Finally, he gave in. I learned to be a loving and kind teacher, because that's how I was treated through the sponsorship program. The lawyer defending Dalits wrongly accused



During childhood I lost both of my parents. My sister and I lived with my uncle. I was 10 when sponsors began helping my community. It was 1995, and many children were employed making fireworks.

Immediately, work began to end child labour, and kids started going to school.

#### You transform children's ambitions.

There are lots of false criminal cases filed against poor people. No one else in my Dalit (lower caste) community practices law. I wanted to be the first lawyer to speak out for their rights. My sponsor helped shape and sharpen my ideas to achieve my goals. Sponsorship made it possible to access trainings that built my knowledge and political awareness, which helped me select good school courses and pursue a higher education. My success helps my family and serves as an inspiration to others. I love being a legal guide in whom poor people can have faith.

#### Anandharaj, 33 | India





I come from a large, humble family. Children were expected to work and help with expenses — not study. I sold candies at the city market while my mother sold cassava. The sponsorship program taught me I had rights and

helped me learn how to defend them.

### Even though I worked on the streets, I was taught I could achieve my dreams.

I always dreamed of graduating university and helping those most in need. To do so, I had to leave my parents' house, search for employment to cover my studies and prioritize education before anything else — not temporary jobs, parties or even friends. It was very challenging. But, I succeeded. I earned bachelor degrees in nursing and social work. Now, I work six-hour hospital shifts as a nurse. This allows me to spend mornings at home with my daughters. At night, I dedicate myself to the university, sharing my experience and knowledge with young people. I've also formed youth groups, and I'm a social activist, too.

#### Do not get tired of doing good. You are changing a life, a family, a community and our world.

The sponsorship program helped me fulfil my dreams. I accessed vocational training, leadership and project development camps, a computer course and scholarships. Now, I have a stable job, I've formed a family with my wife and two daughters, and my income is improving their quality of life.

Thank you to every sponsor for the kind support you give communities. The only way to change our quality of life is with education. Education opens doors. Please keep helping. You are helping us become better people.

Instead, funds donated to Children Believe are distributed directly to countries of operation for program activities. #### Ending child marriage in INDIA

If you're a girl born in India, your dreams of an education may end with child marriage. The country is home to more child brides than any other in the world,15.5 million.\*

With the help of Children Believe and 72 civil society partners and government in Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh and Telangana, young people are standing up for what they believe in and changing cultural attitudes about child marriage.

The three-month STOP Child Marriage NOW campaign:

- **Reached more than 1.2 million people** across 1,430 villages and 2,300 schools and colleges
- **Increased awareness** of the impact of child marriage, existing laws and a child helpline
- **Inspired communities and schools** to pledge to promote "child-marriage free villages"

Next up, we're partnering with a South-Asian coalition to broaden the scope of our work in areas where high rates of child marriage are reported – building on the wave of change sweeping many rural villages.

#### Stopping violence against children in AFRICA

What can you do with a little help from your friend? A lot, if your friend (and partner) is the African Child Policy Forum, an influential policy research and advocacy centre standing up for African children's rights.

To help African countries make child protection a priority, we'll be pooling our resources on four key issues:

- Preventing extreme forms of violence against children by promoting national and regional dialogues and campaigns
- Enhancing the voices of children and youth through children and youth polls and other projects
- **Delivering legal protection to orphaned and vulnerable children** by strengthening the Child Protection Systems in countries we work
- Advancing child rights and accountability by helping African countries develop and implement national policies and action plans

#### Helping children speak up and be heard

Any actions aimed at helping protect children from violence must take into account their experiences. To help children's voices be heard, we partnered on a global survey with nearly 5,500 children in 15 countries and the ChildFund Alliance (our fabulous family of 11 organizations working for children in more than 60 countries). Below are highlights from *Small Voices, Big Dreams 2019*.

> **1 In 2 children** surveyed said that in their country **adults do not listen** to their opinion on issues that matter to them

More than 40% believe that children are not sufficiently protected against violence in the country where they live

> 9 in 10 believe that recognizing and being aware of their rights is a key factor for preventing and tackling violence

More than 60% believe children can do something to put an end to violence

69% of children reject violence as an educational tool

#### Empowering children to take action

Children Believe's Global Youth Ambassador Program is gearing up for launch to help children champion gender equality, education for girls and boys and freedom from violence. A call for inspired youth to apply has been made in Canada and Paraguay, with other countries to follow.

Your continued support will provide opportunities for young people to connect through events and online exchanges, building their skills and abilities to take small, purposeful actions to change the world. We look forward to sharing how these young leaders will help raise the voices of children everywhere.

## YOU ASKED US:

What do I need to know about the name change?

#### Why did you change your name?

We reach out to children of all faiths, ethnicities and cultures, and all people who want to make a difference in their lives. Yet, in the countries we work, there was often confusion about whether we served children of other faiths. As a commitment to our Christian faith principles, we want every child to feel excited and proud our name represents them and every person to feel inspired and welcome to join our cause. With so many children socially excluded or discriminated against in their communities, often on the basis of faith, it's important children of all religions see themselves reflected in our name.

#### Why did you choose the name Children Believe?

The name Children Believe reflects the brave and beautiful beliefs of every child — and your belief in making their dreams come true. Whether it's a boy who dreams of learning to read, or a girl who aspires to be a teacher, mechanic or doctor, we want to help children believe they can do the extraordinary. You believe in the potential and possibility of every child, and you help them believe it, too.

### What's the difference between Children Believe and Christian Children's Fund of Canada?

We've changed our name, not who we are. Children Believe shares the same mission, vision and values as Christian Children's Fund of Canada. For nearly 60 years, we've followed the example of Christ by serving the poor regardless of their faith, cultural and ethnic background. We will continue to do so. We're focusing our efforts on empowering children to overcome barriers preventing them from accessing education, staying in school and pursuing their dreams.

### Will I need to re-establish my monthly pre-authorized payments?

No, our new name does not impact your pre-authorized payment arrangements.

### Will the name change affect my credit-card transactions?

No, this change does not impact your credit-card transactions. Children Believe Fund will appear on your credit-card statements.

#### To whom should I make my cheques payable?

Your cheques should be made payable to Children Believe Fund. Don't worry if you've already sent cheques designating funds to Christian Children's Fund of Canada. Our bank has given us a grace period to accommodate the name change. We kindly ask you make your next batch of cheques payable to Children Believe Fund.

### Will Christian Children's Fund of Canada's name appear on my 2019 tax receipt?

No, your tax receipt will refer to Children Believe Fund. But, it will include all donations made in 2019.
