Hema: I painted about tailoring. My sister is trained very well in the tailoring course. I'm thankful to the people who supported this program.

Manisha: I like the pond cleaning and deepening program. Water is used for cattle and irrigating vegetable crops. We are getting food. Thank you.

Iliyaz: Near our village, children get married in childhood and suffer a lot. Now, child marriages are decreasing. Thank you for helping us stop child marriages.

Sameera: I drew notebooks. I've received notebooks for two years. [Now] I can study well. The notebooks are very useful. I'm very thankful.

Balu: Our school leaked when it rained. It got new windows and was painted, too. Our school is perfect now. Thank you for supporting our school renovation.

Sonia: I painted about child-rights protection. I'm very thankful to those who made me aware [of my rights].

Families pay it forward

"I used to go to school without eating," six-year-old Nashira (pictured) tells me. "This gave me a lot of pain in my stomach." She looks up at her mom shyly. "Sometimes, I followed classmates and begged for food. My mother didn't like it. I couldn't help it. I was hungry." Nashira looks back at me and grins. "Now, I don't worry about what to eat."

It can be hard to imagine how a single gift can change a life. But in Ghana, I've seen it many times.

Thanks to thoughtful people like you who gave through our Gifts for Good catalogue, I saw 87 crop farmers enrolled in a village and savings loan association (VSLA) each receive a flock of three goats.

The VSLA members, including Nashira's parents, have suffered severe hardship in recent years due to erratic rainfall and drought. The goats provide a secondary source of income and are an excellent source of protein.

Since the goats were distributed they've reproduced. Twenty-nine new VSLA members have each been given three baby goats from the litters — the foundation of a herd. So far. 687 children have directly benefited!

Twelve-year-old Abdul's mother received three goats. It came at a time when Abdul wanted to drop out of school. He was ashamed of his tattered and patched school uniform and taunts from his classmates.

"That night I slept holding the new uniform."

Abdul, 12 (pictured right)

"One day I found a uniform in my room," Abdul tells me smiling. "When my mom said it was mine I had tears in my eyes. That night I slept holding the new uniform, eager to go to school and show my friends."

Library sparks hope and happiness

Twelve-year-old Abonesh likes reading biology and chemistry books. Fourteen-year-old Biruk prefers reading anything to do with physics. Yesmashewa, 12, and Endashaw, 14, love reading just about everything.

Books mean so much to children in Ethiopia. For those living in poverty, reading truly opens a world of opportunity that empowers them for the future. Reading books can plant the seeds of imagination, curiosity and creativity; help children succeed in school; and inspire them to dream big.

It was the generosity of caring monthly Community Rise donors that made it possible for Christian Children's Fund of Canada to support the building of an elementary school library in a children's school and fill it with 300 books. It's an incredibly special gift to the school's 1,252 students. These four book-loving children, were happy to share what the library means to them.

Abonesh: I use the library for my school assignments. I enjoy reading under the shade of a tree

Biruk: I wish to be an engineer when I grow up, so I love reading physics books. I come to the library four days a week and spend many hours here.

"I encourage my friends to read." – Abonesh, 12

Yesmashewa: I am happy to have this library. I love reading books! We learn things we don't know and how to solve our problems. I read for more than two hours every day. I wish to be a doctor.

Endashaw: My reading skills have improved. And, if I keep using the library, I know my grades will get even better. This will enable me to go to university.

An inspiring survivor

April 14, 2008 is an unforgettable day for one family in Paraguay.

Eighteen-month-old Rubén (pictured at age five and 10) was playing outside his home with the family dog. His mother, Estela, was nearby feeding chickens and boiling a large pot of water for cooking. Suddenly, the dog knocked over the pot and boiling water splashed onto Rubén.

"My sponsor always writes to me and gives me strength."

"We wrapped him up and took him [20 km] to the city's hospital by motorcycle. He cried all the way," shared his mom. "Rubén was transferred immediately to the national burn hospital [where he spent the next month in an induced comal. The doctors did not have much hope."

Since then, there has been intensive physiotherapy, special creams and five surgeries to extend his skin, which was burned on 30 percent of his body. And he will need more surgeries.

But, thanks in part to a big-hearted, loyal sponsor like you, Rubén has grown into the confident, soccerplaying boy he is today with dreams of becoming a doctor.

"The [sponsorship] program has always helped us," shared Rubén's mom. "It's helped us reach health consultants, make doctor follow-ups, and even pay for medicine. We will always be grateful."

"I have no words to thank my sponsor [for everything]," shared Rubén. "She helps me feel better. I write to her telling her about my school and my health and that I'm very good now."

Thank you for making a difference in so many children's lives.

The gift of health

Whatever gift you send your sponsored child for a birthday or holiday, it truly makes them feel special. Sometimes, it even ends up helping in ways you didn't expect. It did for the sponsor of 17-year-old Fernanda.

When Fernanda was 15, she was diagnosed with lupus, a disease in which the immune system attacks healthy cells and tissues. There's no known cure. The diagnosis was devastating for Fernanda, a girl known in her community for being active in children's rights workshops.

"I had swollen joints, rashes, hair loss, fever and extreme fatigue," shares Fernanda.

"I did not attend school for five months. Walking was almost impossible. Some days I couldn't lift a glass of water because of the pain. I wanted to go out with my friends. I wanted my life as it was in the past. I didn't know how my family could pay for medicine."

It was then that we alerted Fernanda's sponsor that her original gift for school supplies would be used to buy medicine to help the family. She was eager to assist.

"Lupus won't stop me from achieving my dreams."

"The gift was very helpful for my entire family," says Fernanda. "I receive this support twice a year. Those are the best months in the year [since my mother can't afford the medicine]."

Now the teen has new interests and hope for the future.

"I started reading Isabel Allende and other writers on my trips for treatments," she shares. "And, I want to be a doctor or engineer. A sponsor can change a person's life."

A safe place to learn

"I spent two years in a straw-shed classroom," shares Marie (pictured), a Grade 6 student. "It was not easy."

Recently, I visited a primary school in Burkina Faso to talk with children about what it was like to learn in one of more than 4.000 straw-shed classrooms in the country.*

The temporary classrooms — dark, fragile and unsafe — were built to avoid turning children away from the overcrowded school. That was before kind supporters like you helped build and equip three cement, sand and rock classrooms with 56 writing benches, six blackboards, and three desks and chairs for teachers.

Thirteen-year-old Marie, and 14-year-old Rémi, two of 198 students at the school, were eager to share their experiences.

Marie: When it rained, we used to run [out of class], or we rushed home before the rain. The wind sometimes

took the roof off. One day it fell on us. Once it falls, donkeys rush to eat the straw. Even when there was no wind, passing donkeys ate the straw stems. We would chase them away but they always came back.

"Now we can sit in classrooms without being worried."

Rémi: Very often we found snakes [hiding in the straw]. One day, we saw one and everyone ran out, including our teacher. Luckily no one was hurt, and the snake was killed. When we sat in those classrooms, we were never at ease. Thank you for our safe new classrooms!

Children require our best efforts to ensure they have a chance at a healthy and happy life. This project gives us a sense of helping kids in challenging situations and meaningfully changing their lives.



Standing up against child marriage

India has the highest number of child brides in the world — an estimated 47 percent of girls in India are married before their eighteenth birthday (UNICEF).

Three years ago, 18-year-old Usha (pictured) came close to being a part of that statistic. What made the difference is a child-protection program that's helping 4,746 children and youth, like Usha, understand their rights, report violations and take action.

Usha wanted to tell her story.

"When my mother told me I had to marry my 31-year-old uncle [17 years older than me], I cried and shouted. My mother reacted very badly and had relatives come to convince me. I was absolutely scared of anybody coming to my house.

Right away I told a child-protection committee member, left a note in the complaint box and spoke to CCFC's local partner, SPEECH. The issue was

brought to the attention of the government child helpline SPEECH runs [and promotes].

Immediately a team from the Social Welfare Board, Anti-Human Trafficking police unit and SPEECH came to talk to me and my family.

Since then, I've been in a hostel so I can continue my education safe from child marriage. Now I'm going to college for nursing.

"If I was forced to marry, I would have committed suicide."

Usha, 18

I am grateful to Canadians for their support. I am empowered because of the [child-protection] program. It has built up my resilience to fight against injustice. I want to become an advocate pleading for girls like me."



Describe vourself in three words? Happily retired, fortunate.

Why have you committed to making a legacy gift?

I look at my responsibility to my sponsored children the same way I look at my responsibility to care for my wife and children if anything should happen to me. I am blessed in my life, and I have an obligation to help others.

How does giving this way make vou feel?

It makes me feel like I am doing what I should be doing. It's very important to me.



Our warm and friendly staff are happy to help you! Below are answers to some frequently asked questions.

Can I fund a project?

Liz: Yes! Transform Communities is Christian Children's Fund of Canada's (CCFC) program that lets you invest in projects with clear start and end dates and measurable outcomes we report. Funding is desperately needed for projects that address education, clean water and sanitation, health and nutrition, and sustainable economic growth. We're happy to match a project to your interests and passions.

Does CCFC only support Christian children?

Dawn: We help children regardless of their faith. Our work does not involve evangelism. Children are selected for sponsorship based on their need to access the basic necessities of life — not because of their ethnicity, religion or culture.

I'm already sponsoring a child, why should I send a special gift for Easter, Christmas or his/her birthday?

Annie: For many children in vulnerable communities, birthdays and special occasions may pass with little or no fanfare. If you want to do something extra special to make a child's life brighter, or provide a life-changing opportunity, your gift will be cherished for many years to come. Sponsors often give money for colouring books, new clothes and even college tuition.

What should I write about in letters to my sponsored child?

Amanda: Your message can be simple and short. Tell your child about your family, work or the place where you live. Photos or postcards are helpful to describe daily life. A few words of encouragement can mean a lot!

How can I make a bequest?

Laura: Making a gift through your Will is one of the easiest ways to make a planned gift. Your income won't be affected, and you can receive significant tax benefits. With the help of your financial advisor, you can include language in your Will specifying what gifts are to be made as part of your estate plan. Donors often make a bequest, because they wish to leave a legacy of hope, education and empowerment to vulnerable children.

What do I get with my Community Rise monthly giving plan?

Vikky: Most popular is our Leader Plan. You'll receive a Community Rise eNewsletter, and invitations to join our Facebook group and to take part in our monthly Facebook Live Rise and Shine series (it includes video updates, interviews and Q&As). If you'd like to give a little more, those in our Champion Plan receive an annual invitation to meet field-office staff and learn more about our community projects.

I'm not sure what to choose from the gift catalogue; any advice?

Nutan: With 37 amazing gifts, picking just one can be hard. A popular option is our matched gifts which multiply in value up to five times! My favourite items include:

- schoolbooks (\$35);
- keep a child safe (\$85);
- help where the need is greatest (\$100); and
- keep a girl in school for a year (\$125).

Further, as part of our social impact strategy, CCFC does not employ expatriates in our field offices. We are committed to hiring nationals.






Youth (aged 15 to 24) who attend secondary school








Children under the age of five who have received medical checkups to monitor their weight and height

Preventing irregular child migration in Central America

CCFC is leading a project to improve the well-being of children and youth who are at risk of irregular migration. The initiative addresses many of the root causes — from high levels of crime and violence, limited employment and educational opportunities, to social exclusion and a lack of information on the dangers of migrating without following the normal immigration procedures.









Canada-Africa initiative to address maternal, newborn and child mortality

CCFC has partnered with three Canadian organizations to improve the delivery of essential health services to moms, pregnant women, newborns and children under the age of five; increase the use of improved health services; and improve the consumption of nutritious foods and supplements. Our partners are working in Kenya, Malawi and Tanzania.









Promoting maternal, newborn, infant and child sustainable health efforts

CCFC is leading an initiative that aims to reduce maternal and child mortality in Africa through an integrated approach focusing on health-service delivery and use as well as improved nutrition. It promotes respectful and supportive maternity care as well as mother and baby-friendly environments. It also fosters engagement by fathers and ensures supportive supervision for new mothers.





Protecting children from traditional mining sites

Many children in Burkina Faso take on dangerous work in traditional mining sites to support themselves and their families. With funding from the European Union, CCFC is working with EDUCO to protect children from child labour and exploitation by strengthening child protection mechanisms, helping children go to school, and supporting income-generating activities that will help pay for families' basic needs and children's education.
